

What services does KOTM provide?

- Access to doctor's appointments, educational & administrative events through videoconferencing without having to leave your community

What is a Telemedicine Appointment?

- A private visit with your doctor using video conferencing, saving you time and money on travel
- Telemedicine can also be used to save lives in critical and emergency care

How do I get referred for a telemedicine appointment?

- Ask your local nurse or doctor to fill out a Telemedicine Referral Form
- Forms are at the nursing station and in your CTC's office
- Our schedulers will contact your local CTC with the appointment information

What is a CTC?

- Community Telemedicine Coordinator
- A member of your community health staff who promotes and is trained in the use of the telemedicine equipment
- CTCs are located in 26 KO Telemedicine First Nation Communities
- CTCs work together as a team to provide quality of care service to all telemedicine patients

How do I know my information is kept private and secure?

- KO eHealth follows the "Personal Health Information Protection Act" (PHIPA) which is the provincial legislation in regards to privacy
- We take great measures to ensure that your personal health information is protected and kept private
- Our CTCs are trained in privacy and sign a privacy agreement as well as abide by our oath of confidentiality
- We sound proof rooms when possible and offer headphones for patients during clinical appointments

What should I bring to a Telemedicine appointment?

- Valid health card
- Status card
- List of current medications
